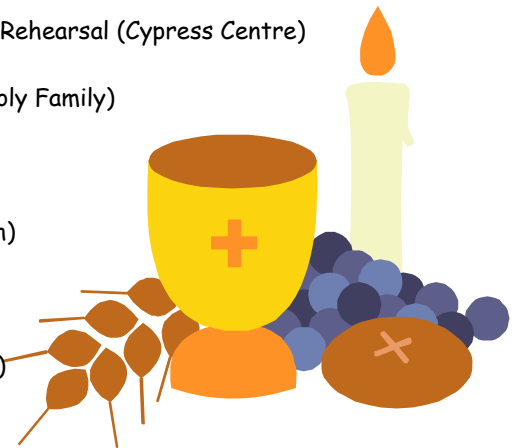

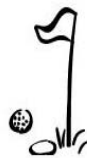

READ THIS CAREFULLY; IT AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS

By signing this document you, your family and representatives give up the right to sue

In consideration of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Calgary permitting me to participate in the Diocese of Calgary Youth Rally on Christ the Redeemer School Board premises, and on behalf of myself, my heirs, executors, successors, administrators, assigns and whomever else may have an interest either at common law or by operation of statute (collectively "the Releaser"), I agree as follows:

1. I hereby waive any and all claims I may have now used in the future, release from all liability and agree not to sue, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Calgary and its officers, directors, employees, representatives (collectively "the Releasee") for any and all personal injury, sickness, death, property damage or loss sustained by me as a result of my participation in the Diocese of Calgary Youth Rally, from any cause whatever, including but not limited to, negligence on the part of the Releasee. For the purposes of this Agreement, the "Diocese of Calgary Youth Rally" shall include all activities from the time of my arrival at Holy Trinity Academy premises to my final departure there from. _____ Initials

I hereby waive the protection afforded by any statute or law in any jurisdiction whose purpose, substance or effect is to provide that a general release shall not extend to claims, materials or otherwise, which the person giving the release does not know or suspect to exist at the time of executing the release. _____ Initials

I agree to indemnify, defend and sure harmless, the Releasee from all claims, causes of action, damages, judgments, costs or expenses, including lawyer's fees, which in any way arise from the Releasee's participation in the Diocese of Calgary Youth Rally at Holy Trinity Academy facilities. _____ Initials

In entering into this Agreement I am not relying on any oral or written representations or statements made by the Releasee to induce me to enter into and participate in the Diocese of Calgary Youth Rally. I further agree that the terms of this Agreement may only be amended by a duly executed written agreement between the Releasee and myself and that this Agreement shall not be effected or altered by any subsequent oral or written representations made by the Releasee or anyone acting on its behalf. _____ Initials

April 12, 2011 – MEDICINE HAT CATHOLIC BOARD OF EDUCATION

PRESENTATION –

PRESENTATION – The Board recognizes the significant contribution the *Catholic Schools in our community make to the Annual Rotary Music Festival*. PRESENTATION – Mr. Rolf Traichel, Director of Information Systems was in attendance to provide the Board with an overview of the *Information Systems* in the Division. It is evident that the Division Information Technology profile has expanded exponentially in the last number of years including both the quantity and type of equipment supported as well as the extent of services offered to both students and staff. The Division is proud of the *State of the Art technologies* in both the hardware and software applications available to Division students and staff. Future plans are to continue to consolidate infrastructure services including, but not limited to, the Student Information Reporting System and the Division phone system. Preparation continues to support the use of *Student Owned Devices*. The goals for the IT Department remain challenging; but we continue to be excited about adapting new technologies to better the Division overall.

BUDGET 2011 – 2012 – The Board of Trustees announced they met in-camera to review the draft Budget. The following motion was presented in the public meeting: THAT the Board of Trustees direct Senior Administration to *further revise the budget* and that the Board hold a *Special Board Meeting on Tuesday, May 24, 2011 @ 6:00 p.m.* to approve the budget for the 2011 – 2012 school year.

BOARD ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING – Annually the Board holds an organizational meeting to determine *Committee Representatives* and the roles of *Chair and Vice-Chair*. The Board wishes to engage in that process prior to the end of each school year rather than after the start of the school year. This practice will comply with regulations set out in the School Act and Board Policy beginning this year.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT • The Superintendent reported that the *Three Year Education Plan and Annual Education Results Reports* will again be a combined report submitted to the Province.

• *École St. Thomas d'Aquin Modular Classroom* (portable) -The Division removed the modular at the elementary school from the *active inventory*, following an engineering report that determined there are some structural issues with the modular. Although the recommendation did not indicate the building was unsafe, a decision was made to no longer use that facility at this time.

• *Town Hall Meetings* are being held to engage our Support Staff and Teaching Staff to provide them the opportunity to tell us what is working well and what can be improved upon in their assignments, their schools and the school division overall. A *Community Town Hall Meeting* is planned for *May 09, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at Holy Family Parish*. The meeting will engage stakeholders on the *2011-2012 Budget, Centennial Celebrations* and the *Board's Strategic Plan*. Please plan to attend.

• *Centre for Academic & Personal Excellence (CAPE)* – The Board of Trustees & Senior Administration plan to schedule a meeting with the Board & Senior Administration from CAPE to discuss our current partnership and future opportunities that might exist. CAPE currently leases the former St. Louis School, a facility owned by the Board.

TRANSPORTATION CONSULTANT – A consultant was hired to review the *School Bus Transportation System* as a whole, not including St. Michael's School Bow Island. The report is to provide an *objective opinion of school bus routes, pick up & drop off locations, ride times, impact of cross attendance etc.* Outcomes of the findings along with recommendations will be presented to the Board in June in the form of a report.

SOUTHRIDGE TRANSPORTATION AGREEMENT WITH NOTRE DAME

– The City of Medicine Hat *will no longer be providing the city bus service through Southridge to take students to Notre Dame*. Historically the Board paid for the city bus pass for those particular students. There is no contractual agreement between MHCBE and the City. In light of the decision by City Transit, the Board passed the following motion: THAT the Board works with Totem Transportation to find the most efficient manner of transporting *eligible middle school students* in *Southridge to Notre Dame Academy*.

THREE YEAR CAPITAL PLAN The Board approved the Three Year Capital Plan to 2014. The primary features of the plan are the construction of a *New Elementary School in Sector 5* and the *Modernization of Monsignor McCoy High School*.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATIONS – In May, the Student Logo Contest winner will be announced. The art work will be published as the official LOGO celebrating *100 Years of Catholic education*. The student will be recognized at their school assembly; will receive a *special certificate and a \$100 Gift Card to Cole's (Chapters/Indigo) Book Store!*
